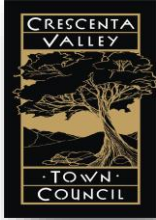

- I. Welcome/Introductions- Desiree Rabinov introduced- Attendees: Harry Leon, Council, and County staff: Shirley Lai, and Jonathan Gonzalez and residents: Joe Koenig
- II. Agenda overview/additions/changes-Desiree confirmed no changes/edits.
- III. Update on Open Issues
 - a) County DPW staff liaisons/ CVTC updates- Jonathan Gonzalez provided an overview of the current projects under review.
 - County DPW staff-CVTC Streets/Intersections list update, report findings, and site visits conducted- Jonathan has requested more CHP enforcement for those streets identified in the street matrix that speeding occurs.
 - New requests from Community and Council-None reported.
 - Update Orange Avenue Pedestrian sidewalk survey - Shirley Lai reported for Andrew Ross that Public Outreach would be conducted one more time to confirm approval from the residents on Orange. The timeline will be provided at the January meeting.
- IV. Old Business
 - b) Metro Open Streets Grant application for December 2020 with Supervisor's office- Shirley Lai reported for Andrew Ross that there is no update at that this time. A clearer timeline will be presented at the next meeting.
 - c) Expansion of the La Crescenta Bike route network grant opportunities- Shirley Lai indicated that staff had applied to the BTA funding program to develop our bike network further. The application was not approved because it didn't meet a disadvantaged community's criteria rather considered an affluent community. Staff has looked at alternative funding sources, and currently, there isn't another source to



apply. Staff will be updating the Bike master plan, which may provide a better opportunity to seek a wider funding scale.

- d) Soundwall additional funding agreement Measure R update- Ricardo Gordillo had no updates for Shirley to report. She indicated staff is working closely to complete the funding agreements with Metro.
- e) Safe Routes to School Plan Development County prioritization/criteria SCAG application due Nov 13th update- Shirley Lai reported for John Burton/Andrew Ross indicating that the application was submitted on Dec 11th to SCAG. More to come at the next meeting
- f) Foothill Blvd., Compete Streets grant application timeline update-Caltrans ATP grant program- Shirley shared the good news that staff will plan in-house to create a LA County Master Plan to include the Foothill blvd and primary streets active transportation corridor. Due to unsuccessful attempts in applying for grant funding over the past three years, staff has decided to use their local budget. The Planning process will be initiated sometime in February 2021. More details at the January meeting.
- g) Measure M funding update for future infrastructure improvements (LA County Master Plan Update)- Shirley Lai will have an update in January.

V. New Business

- a) Updates on EV charging stations at Public Parks and facilities: Shirley updated us that the Internal Service Development dept, which the Supervisors created, coordinates with the Sustainability Plan office. This effort will be coordinated with the County CEO's office and Edison to determine the planning and implementation process to form a cooperative agreement to install EV stations by 2025.
- b) County Vision Zero Slow Streets update- Shirley provided a PowerPoint presentation on Vision Zero traffic and safety initiative. Residents can go online to complete an application and request street signage at "Slow Streets" to be placed. Or you can call 1-833-VZ4-LACO or go to visionzerolacounty.com. A street Captian/Ambassador is req.
