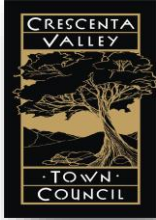

- I. Welcome/Introductions- Desiree Rabinov Attendees: Councilmembers Desiree Rabinov, Johnny Brookbank, Carin Hoffman, Harry Leon. County staff: Shirley Lai, and Jonathan Gonzalez. Residents: Liz Benbrook, Pamela, Mike Baldwin, Susan Kilpatrick
- II. Agenda overview/additions/changes-All—CV resident requested to address potholes on Ramsdell between North of Foothill Blvd., and Orange Avenue. Contact is Steven Gutierrez from Roadway maintenance with DPW will be notified by Jonathan Gonzalez.
- III. Update on Open Issues
 - a) County DPW staff liaisons/ CVTC updates- Jonathan Gonzalez
 - County DPW staff-CVTC Streets/Intersections list update, report findings, and site visits conducted and outcomes- Jonathan provided updates to the Street Safety Study Matrix for streets that are either in review or nearing completion of design with recommended infrastructure measures. Bulb-out designs will be forwarded to the Council for review and comments. See attached Matrix for updates.
 - New requests from Community and Council-all. None were submitted.
 - b) Update Orange Avenue Pedestrian sidewalk survey/La Crescenta Avenue project – Shirley Lai reported for Andrew Ross that an Outreach event is being planned for Thursday, March 25 from 6-7 pm. Desiree will verify with Mike Baldwin to determine any conflicts with the CV chamber. Desiree will provide Shirley with a stakeholder list by end of the week. Other Council outreach efforts include using our website, social media, and listserv through constant contact to distribute notification of outreach virtual event. Also, we recommended advertising in the CV Weekly news.

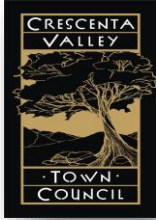


IV. Old Business

- c) Metro Open Streets Grant application for December 2020 with Supervisor's office- Shirley reported for John Burton that the cost estimates are still under development and pending supervisor's submittal. John Burton's office is preparing the application. No date was provided as to when it will be submitted and approved by the Supervisor's office. Desiree will follow up with Mr. Burton's office to get a better timeline.
- d) Soundwall additional funding agreement Measure R update- Shirley reported for Ricardo Gordillo that County staff is coordinating with Caltrans to program the funding with Metro.
- e) Foothill Blvd., Compete Streets -LA County Master Plan. County staff is developing the Plan- Shirley reported for Andrew Ross which County Staff met with Glendale and LCF and agreed to be active participants. Current planning efforts underway is coordinating traffic analysis and preparing existing conditions report. The report shall be finished in August 2021 which will follow an outreach engagement plan to the community.
- f) Measure M funding update for future infrastructure improvements – Shirley will follow up with Andrew Ross and Ricardo Gordillo on the fund amount to be allocated to the Soundwall program.

V. New Business

- a) County Vision Zero Slow Streets update-Shirley Lai gave a presentation, see attached, of the number of Slow Streets signs that have been implemented. They have been receiving positive feedback and a large increase in requests. - b) Bus Stop Improvement Plan survey conducted 2016 for Foothill Blvd.-Shirley reported that staff had completed the survey in 2018 and approved it in 2019. The majority of survey recipients selected a contemporary design bus shelter. The rollout will be in four phases over the next four years, starting at the end of 2021. Phase I will install 80 shelters. It's unknown which phase La Crescenta-Montrose is in.



- c) Crosswalk enhancement examples- County staff will investigate if approved a creative/artistic style of crosswalks has been implemented. Also, staff will review the Active Transportation guidelines if this is an eligible application of a safe pedestrian measure.
