8. Community Reports
 - a. Sheriff – Sergeant Lee/Captain Vienna – May report – 2 aggravated assaults, 21 larceny, 2 vandalism, 0 narcotics, 4 fraud ID thefts, 106 citations and 51 warnings. Citations decreased from 110 to 106, residential burglaries are down from 2025, 11 catalytic converter thefts (almost all Prius), 2 suspects arrested, thefts increased 17 in April to 19 in May. National Night Out August 4 5-8 p.m. at Sheriff Station, flyer will be given to CVTC for social media. Catalytic converter connected to organized efforts in the area. Summer team is out in the area. F-150 is summer team (Budwig and Underwood). Still at stalemate with Flock language. Thank you to CV Sheriff Support group fundraising – funded a drone (\$14,600) and hoping to get a drone fleet in the area in the future. Time from getting a call for assistance to a getting a drone in the area is less than 5 minutes. Please be safe on July 4 – equipped for DUI enforcement
 - b. Los Angeles Fire – no one here
 - c. CHP - Officer Bay - 7 traffic crashes, 4 hit and run (early AM), no DUIs, enforcement issued 1600 citations since last year at this time, 758 speeding, over 100 mph – 27, actively enforcing seat belts – weekly inspections of car seats every Wednesday 8 a.m. to noon at the CHP office 626-296-8100 schedule an appointment. Focusing on recovering stolen vehicles (statewide goal is 47,000 recovered vehicles), firearm seizures (statewide goal 5,500), fentanyl seizures (goal 2,000 lbs, currently at 2,500), crimes against children (100 investigations, 83 currently). E bike safety in May at Library, hope to have more. Presented Officer Bae with a certificate of appreciation – he is leaving for Sacramento.
